

**Have you ever considered the convenience and ease of electronic donations?
It is secure, quick and easy!**

Many donors are using electronic giving as a simple and efficient way of supporting the ministry of St. Paul's Newman Center and many more are inquiring about it. Options include:

Credit/Debit Card Giving: St. Paul's Newman Center can receive credit or debit card donations. Donors can go to our website at www.newmancenter.org and click the **Donate** button on the main page which will quickly and easily assist them in making a donation through *SimpleGive*.

Electronic Fund Transfers: Through this method, donors and St. Paul's Newman Center enter into an agreement where they provide the parish with their bank account number and the amount to be given on a regular basis (5th or 20th of each month.). The Newman Center withdraws the amount from their account each month. Contact sandy@newmancenter.org if you are interested in using this method of donating. Set up is quick and simple.

Online Banking: This allows you to initiate donations online through your bank. You can make recurring donations of fixed amounts and/or one time donations. With online banking, each period (monthly, weekly, etc.) you would notify your bank, using your online banking feature, to send designated donations to St. Paul's Newman Center.

A note about Security

All of these methods are often used to pay routine expenses in our busy lives. Your bank and St. Paul's Newman Center make security a top priority. Every precaution is taken to ensure that your information is transmitted safely and securely. The flexibility built into electronic giving puts the donor in control of the amount, frequency and duration of contributions.
